When Trippe's politico Senator Ralph Owen Brewster accuses Hughes of being a war profiteer, it's Hughes who gains the upper hand. Hughes also had many women in his life including a long relationship with Katharine Hepburn. Nominated for 11

Academy Awards in 2005, winning 5. This movie stars Leonard DiCaprio is rated PG-13 and has a run time of 2 hours and 50 minutes.
