Manhattan Beach by Jennifer Egan

An historical fiction story of family, betrayal and finding the truth in 1940's New York City during the World War II. It tells the haunting, intertwined stories of heroine Anna Kerrigan, the Brooklyn Navy Yard's only female diver, her father Eddie Kerrigan, who works for both the union and the mob, and nightclub owner Dexter Styles, Eddie's complex and charismatic boss.

This autobiography of Fred Haise, Lunar Module Pilot on Appollo 13, is illustrated with black-and-white photographs. It brings the reader into the heart of his experience on that challenging mission--considered NASA's finest hour--and reflects on his life and career as a military fighter pilot and his successful 20-year NASA career.

Grandma Gatewood's Walk: The Story of the Woman Who Saved the Appalachian Trail by Ben Montgomery

Emma Gatewood told her family she was going on a walk and left her small Ohio hometown with a change of clothes and less than two hundred dollars. The next anybody heard from her, this genteel, farm-reared, sixty-seven-year-old great-grandmother had walked 800 miles along the 2,050-mile Appalachian Trail. By September 1955 she stood atop Maine's Mount Katahdin, sang "America, the Beautiful," and proclaimed, "I said I'll do it, and I've done it." The notoriety helped to save the trail.
